## NEWSLETTER CHRISTMAS 2007

### The Harvest

I suppose the best I can say is 'that it could have been worse'. The bad weather at flowering time really hit us. The vines dislike getting their petals wet, and if the bad weather lasts for more than a day or so they just give up. If you remember back to June and July – flowering time – there was almost continuous rain. Luckily one of our varieties, Madeleine Angevine, is not quite so fussy, and managed to produce about two thirds of its normal crop. However the Bacchus failed completely, and our usually reliable Seyval Blanc was very depleted.

We usually have two pickings at harvest, the Madeleine and Bacchus first, and then the Seyvals, which ripen later, about three weeks after. This time however there were so few bunches on the Seyval that we decided to do only one picking. The winery charges a pressing fee for every load we send, regardless of the weight, so we need a worthwhile quantity. In the end we didn't do too badly, we got .07 of a tonne, which made 500 litres of juice. This should produce getting on for 600 bottles. The grapes were also reasonable quality, with good sugar and low acid so should produce a good wine. Apologies to those who couldn't make the first picking and were hoping to come later. You will be on the list for next year.

We are certainly not alone in having a poor crop. It was the same all over the country. One vineyard of 7 acres got nothing at all. Even France had 10% less this year. Lets hope for better next summer.

## Working parties

It is no exaggeration to say that without the help we have had this last year the vineyard would not have been able to keep going. There would probably have been no harvest at all. Both Jim and I are now well into our OAP status, and the vineyard slope seems to get steeper all the time! Our volunteers have helped with the pruning, both summer and winter and with tasks like raking up the prunings, which I certainly could not manage nowadays.

So we will be very grateful for your help again. Pruning days will be 6<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>. January to start with, and there will almost certainly be some days in February as well. Time 9.30 to 1.00 approx. Anyone is welcome, and training is given where required. We don't pay any money but free bottles of Priors Dean wine are available. An alternative is to adopt a row. You then get a key to the vineyard and can come when you like. Please would those who have been adopting a row confirm that they want to continue next year.

## Sales

We are starting our Christmas wine deliveries now, so if you have not yet contacted us we are ready and waiting for your call. Remember what an excellent gift Priors Dean wine makes, and ideal as an aperitif in the festive season.
